


Fox Chapel Borough Trail System



Fox Chapel Trails

The Borough of Fox Chapel was formed in 1934 with the intent of keeping a “rural” character. Careful zoning and preservation of the Borough’s Park Lands, where stream valleys were used as the core of the Park system has made it a very desirable place to live.


All the Fox Chapel Parks are open daily between sunrise to sunset. The 491 acres of mostly interconnecting parks, open space and trails provide natural corridors for wildlife and green spaces to walk, picnic and enjoyment.

SALAMANDER PARK is named for the spotted salamanders that reproduce in the park’s wetland each spring.

TRILLIUM TRAIL is the area of Parkland with greatest concentration of wildflowers. The Trillium are at their peak in late April to early May.

MCCAHILL FIELD is land dedicated for active recreation use. It includes two baseball fields, a basketball court. And a large open field for rugby, touch football and soccer games, as well as a playground for young children. Permits provided free of charge at the Borough Building, are needed for groups of twenty or more.

RIDING MEADOW PARK can be used as a place to walk no more than two dogs which must be under control. Permits from the Borough Building are required for parking in this area.
